



Scholarship Application Form: the deadline to submit is March 15, 2019; send application package to admin@durangoCCL.org. You will receive an email acknowledgement of receipt within 48 hours of submitting your application.

Purpose: Two Fort Lewis College students will be selected to attend CCL's conference and lobby week in Washington DC June 9-11, 2019. The Durango Chapter of CCL will cover transportation, lodging, and provide a stipend for meals. At the conference, the winners will learn more about CCL and Carbon Fee and Dividend legislation, and also learn CCL's lobbying methods. Then they'll join with other CCL members to speak to several Members of Congress about a Carbon Fee and Dividend bill. This bill has just now been re-introduced in the House as the Energy Innovation and Carbon Dividend Act H.R. 763.

Application package must include:

- A short essay of 300-800 words: Tell us why you want to attend the conference and how it would impact your studies and life. Suggestions: include information on your career goals, current community involvement, leadership activities, volunteer work, public speaking experiences, and personal accomplishments.
- Email addresses and phone numbers for two references: One from a teacher or academic official that knows you and your work, and the other from someone not related to you that knows your personal and/or academic achievements.

Pre-conference expectations:

Join the Durango chapter of CCL (if already an active member, get a written recommendation from a chapter leader or FLC leader); attend our local meetings (3rd Wed of month at 5:30p at Himalayan Kitchen); listen to the CCL Intro Call on the website (citizensclimatelobby.org); participate in the online Climate Advocacy Training (or attend a local seminar); participate in local CCL actions.

Post-conference expectations:

Report back after the conference at Durango CCL's next meeting, and submit a 500-700 word reflection on the conference experience. This essay may be submitted to local newspapers as an OpEd. Attend Durango CCL meetings when able. Plan to help CCL efforts in the community: table at Farmer's Market once/month; table at events like environmental films/discussions; write Letters to the Editor (LTEs); call/write your Member of Congress (MoC); join a small team for local lobbying in MoC's Durango offices.
